## All students are required to complete 15.0 credits in General Education.

The requirements are as follows:

- LIBS 7001 - Critical Reading and Writing ( 3.0 credits)
- LIBS 7002 - Applied Ethics ( 3.0 credits) or LIBS 7102 Ethics for Computing Professionals ( 3.0 credits)
- Choose 9.0 credits from the list of Pre-Approved General Education Electives (see below)


## General Education Electives

9.0 credits of General Education Electives are required.

All courses taken outside BCIT for possible transfer credit to BCIT as General Education Electives must be first-year university courses or higher. The course must be academic in nature and belong to one of the four following categories:

- Economics
- Language \& Linguistics
- Humanities
- Mass Communication

Topics in Humanities may include:

- Art History
- History Music
- Psychology
- Classical Studies
- Cultural Studies
- History
- Philosophy
- Religious Studies
- Theatre Studies

Non-BCIT courses eligible to receive credit as General Education Electives for this program must be:

- In one of the identified subject areas above
- Transferable into a recognized Canadian University degree program
- Taken at a recognized public post-secondary educational institution in Canada
- Assessed to determine transferability into a recognized Canadian University degree program, if the course has been completed at a college or technical school outside BC or a university outside Canada.

The BScACS program reserves the right to make the final decision in cases where ambiguity exists over:

- The category and/or level of the course
- The number of transferable credits available for the course

Other BCIT courses not listed below may be eligible in consultation with the Program Head. Courses with S and U grading are not eligible for General Education. No vocational or technical studies courses will be considered for General Education.

Some of the following courses may have prerequisite(s). It is the student's responsibility to meet the prerequisite(s) of these courses, should the student choose to take said courses for their General Education Electives.
